The Curriculum

At Caedmon we have a wide and varied curriculum in Year 7. You will have lots of different subjects all taught by experts. You will have a form tutor who you will see every day for a tutor period in the morning. During this tutor period you will have the chance to organise your week do some active citizenship activities, and develop your reading as a form group. Your form tutor will also deliver personal, social and health education, PHSE for one lesson a week during an extended form time. It might sound daunting, but you will be given a detailed timetable and you can rely on the support of all staff in the school to help you if you need it. There are a wide variety of extra curricular opportunities on offer here at Caedmon, and it's up to you to take

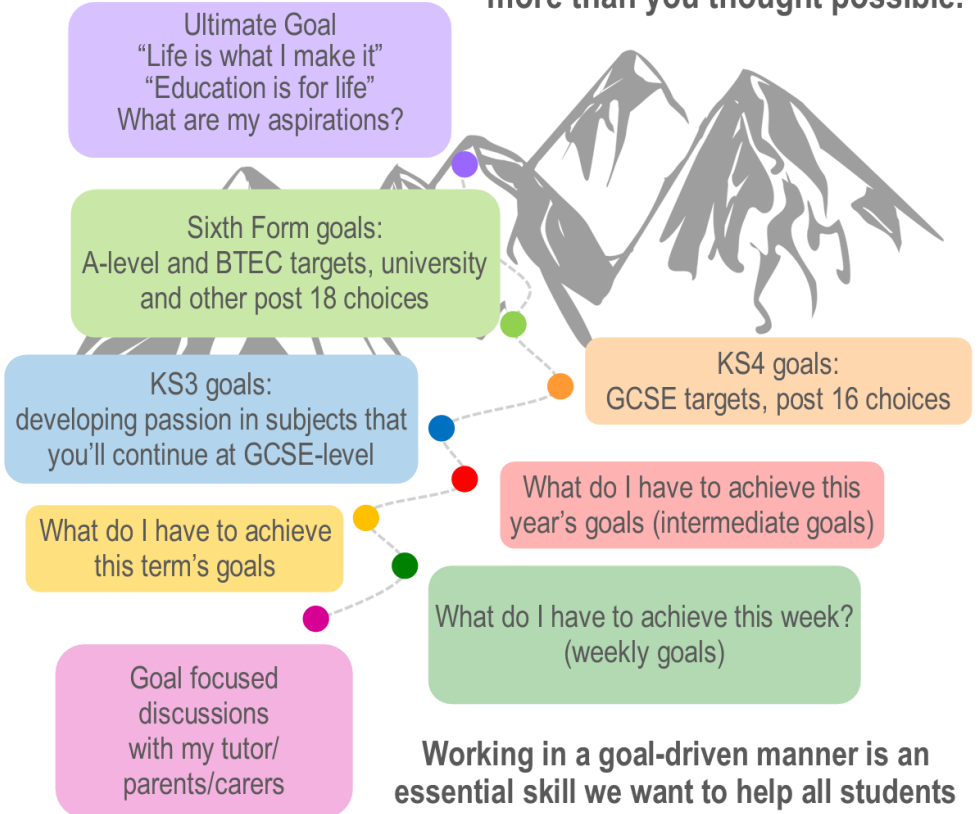

You will get to know lots of subject teachers, and also the members of staff above.

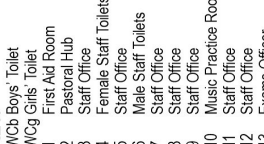
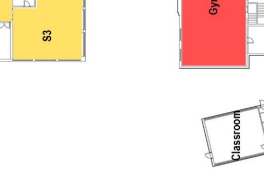
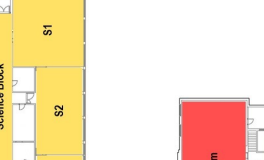
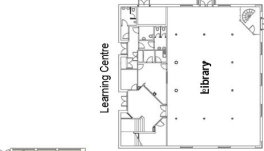
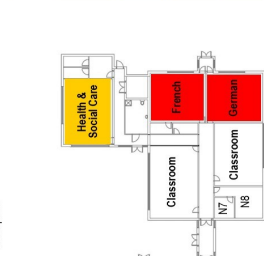
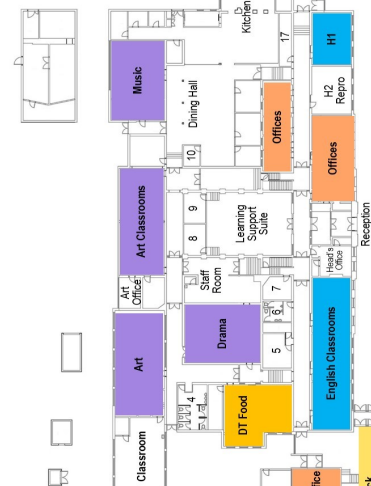
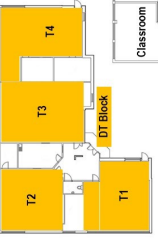
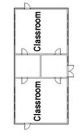
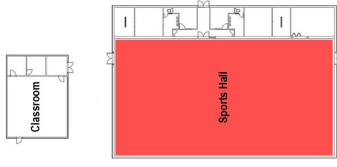
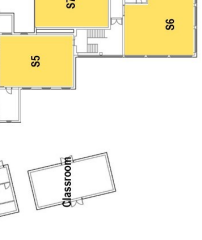
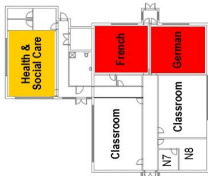
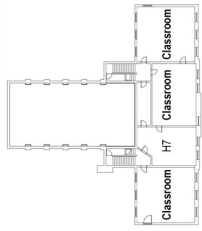
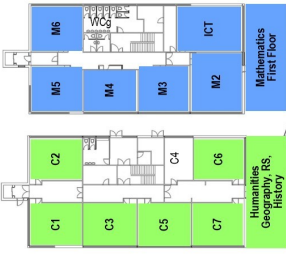
This team of staff are here to support you as you start your journey at CCW, and they aim to get to know you really well!

In Year 7 you'll study:

- 8 hours per fortnight of English
- 8 hours per fortnight of maths
- 6 hours per fortnight of science
- 4 hours per fortnight of PE
- 3 hours per fortnight each of geography and history
- 2 hours per fortnight each of French, German, religious education, food, design technology, ICT, art, drama and music.

Frequently Asked Questions

There are sure to be lots of questions about starting a new school. Your son/daughter can ask any questions they have through the Transition Google Classroom. However, here are the answers to the most frequently asked questions.

What time do I need to be at Caedmon College in the morning?

Lessons begin at 8.55am and you should arrive no later than 8.50am.

What happens if I get lost?

In Year 7, you will be based on our Normanby site which is not too big. All of the classrooms are clearly labelled. On your first morning, you will spend a few hours with your tutor and they will take you to on a tour of the school and show you where your first lesson will be. If you

do get lost, staff and students are always happy to help you.

How will I know which lesson I have and where I need to be?

When you start Caedmon College in September, you will be given a timetable which shows you what lessons you have each day. You will be given help to understand the timetable and find your way to your different lessons. At the start of the day, a bell rings to let you know it is time for the lesson to start. At the end of the lesson, another bell rings as a sign to finish the lesson.

What do I do with my coat and PE kit when I'm not using them?

Lockers are available for a £5 deposit. They are big enough to store your coat, PE kit, cooking ingredients and any other equipment.



What will I do at morning break?

At break time you can buy a snack from the canteen or you can bring your own snack (something healthy) and a bottle of water (no fizzy or energy drinks allowed).

What happens at lunch time?

Lunchtime lasts for 45 minutes, you can either access hot food via the College's cashless system, or you can bring a packed lunch. During the first two weeks in September, Y7 will get access to the canteen a few minutes early to give you plenty of time to get used to the system.

There will be staff on duty in the eating areas should you have any issues.

When is home time? The bell for the end of

the day is at 3.30pm. If you walk home, you are expected to walk home sensibly, still wearing your full uniform. If you catch a bus, you will be shown where to wait. Students travelling by bus or train must have a pass.

What do I do if I am feeling ill or have a problem during the school day?

If you are feeling ill in a lesson, you should tell your teacher who will decide what you should do. In the morning, talk to your tutor if you have a problem, or visit the Pastoral Office.
